The Mayor, Cllr Leach, informed the Council that Borough Cllr Mrs Mellish had donated a framed photograph of herself in her capacity as The Mayor of the Borough of King's Lynn and West Norfolk. The photograph would be hung in the Chamber room alongside Cllr Legg's Mayoral photograph.

1357. To receive Members' Apologies for Absence

Apologies had been received from Cllr J K Fox (holiday), Cllr Mrs S M Nunn (illness), Cllr J J Reed (holiday), Cllr Mrs P A Roberts (holiday) and Cllr Mrs V F Starling (holiday).

The apologies were accepted.

Cllr C Pyatt had arrived for the meeting but left prior to it commencing.

1358. Evacuation Procedures

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, notified those present of the emergency evacuation procedure from the Town Council offices.

1359. To receive Members' Declarations of Interest

Cllr Teverson declared a prejudicial interest in Item 1361, To co-opt new Councillors for the East Ward. The Mayor, Cllr Leach, Cllr Doyle and Cllr Mrs Sharp declared a pecuniary interest in Item 1366, Payment of Bills.

Adjourn meeting for public participation and reports

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, adjourned the meeting.

Police

Inspector Bates reported that there had been a 12% drop in crime in the Western Area over the past 12 months and detections in the sector had been 38%, the highest recorded in the past 5 years. Of the 52 policing areas in West Norfolk, Downham Market stood at number 4 in terms of reduction of crime, which was an excellent achievement.

Inspector Bates reported on crimes since June:

Inspector Bates confirmed that PC Andy Deadman had resumed restricted duties in Town. Sergeant Rowe had been assigned to a special project at Head Office for three months and an acting Sergeant had been temporarily appointed to the post. Norfolk Constabulary was currently being reorganised, and in April 2009 the six main response teams in the area would be assigned to King's Lynn, to form one of six major response teams in the Borough. The next Community Action Group meeting would be held in Methwold on Friday, 24th October 2008.

Q: The Town Clock was recently vandalised. Has anyone been detected for this yet? (JWD).

A: Investigations are ongoing.

Q: A resident in Civray Avenue has reported that gangs of youths are congregating on the green. Could officers keep an eye on this? (SCT).

A: Yes.

Q: Can fireworks be sold to the public throughout the whole year? (MGF).

A: There are no restrictions for businesses to sell fireworks the whole year round, although the proprietors must abide to the age restriction laws.

Q: Has the map in Wymondham been updated to show the correct street names in Downham Market? (CTS).

A: It is believed to have been done. In 2009 all response cars will be fitted with satellite navigation systems.

Q: Satellite navigation systems can send vehicles down small lanes. Will the police avoid doing this? (PBS).

A: If anyone experiences any problems they should report them to Inspector Bates.

There being no further questions, the Mayor, Cllr Leach, thanked Inspector Bates for his report and he left the meeting at 7.52pm.

Public Participation

Members of the public wished to raise concern regarding the poor drainage systems in Bridge Street and Porter Street. Houses in these areas had recently been flooded because the drains could not cope with the heavy downpour of rain.

Cllr Mrs Sharp reported that she had attended a recent meeting regarding environmental matters, where all significant authorities had been present. The main purpose for the meeting was to reorganise the emergency procedures for the Borough.

A member of public confirmed that Anglian Water had been contacted the day after the homes were flooded and although Anglian Water had advised that they would deal with the matter within ten days, no contact was made. When the member of public pursued this enquiry, Anglian Water advised that they had no trace of the initial complaint.

The Clerk would send a letter of complaint to Anglian Water on behalf of the public.

Cllr Sampson noted that two properties in Elizabeth Avenue had been flooded on a previous occasion. Since this occurrence, Anglian Water had started 'Project Downham'.

County Councillor

There was nothing to report to this meeting.

Borough Councillor

There was nothing to report to this meeting.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, resumed the meeting.

1360. To approve the Minutes

The minutes of the Town Council meetings held on Tuesday, 2nd September 2008 (pages 2551-2553) and Tuesday, 9th September 2008 (pages 2558-2566) were approved and signed as a true and accurate record.

1361. To co-opt new Councillors for the following ward: **East Ward (2)**

Cllr Teverson had declared a prejudicial interest in this item.

Two candidates had applied in writing asking to be considered for co-option in the East Ward; Mr David Sharman and Ms Wendy Wallace.

Copies of their letters had been circulated to all members. The Mayor, Cllr Leach, advised that no other written applications had been received.

Mr Sharman and Ms Wallace introduced themselves to the Councillors.

Mr Sharman and Ms Wallace were duly elected as the new Town Councillors and both joined the meeting. The Mayor, Cllr Leach, advised that they would not be able to debate or vote as they had not yet signed their Declarations of Office and Code of Conduct forms. The Mayor, Cllr Leach, welcomed them to the Council.

1362. To receive correspondence

A list of correspondence had been circulated (Appendix 1).

Cllr Mrs Sharp wished to note that an informal hearing was being heard in King’s Lynn regarding a planning appeal by Mr S Lilley for the development at 168 Lynn Road. This was noted.

1363. To receive Councillors questions

Q: Has Tesco refused to erect Christmas lights outside their store this year, and if so, could a letter be sent to the Manager advising of the Council’s dismay to this decision? (MGF).

A: At a recent Chamber of Trade meeting the Manager did advise that they would not be participating in the Town’s Christmas lights switch-on. The Clerk would investigate this matter further and send a letter to the Manager.

Four members of public left the Council Chambers at 8.03pm.

Q: Could a letter of complaint be sent to the BCKL&WN regarding the Development Control Board’s decision to approve the access ramp into the Old Hall, Wales Court Shopping Centre? (JWD).

A: The Deputy Clerk had already sent a letter Mr Ray Harding, Chief Executive, BCKL&WN, with a copy to Cllr N Daubney, Leader of the Council, Mr G Hall, Head of Development Services, Mr S Ashworth, Planning Manager, Cllr Mrs V Spikings, Chairman, Development Control Board, Cllr Mrs K Mellish, Ward Councillor and Ms S Hewitt, Correspondent.

1367. To discuss the removal of the toilet block on The Howdale

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, adjourned the meeting in order for Cllr Mrs Mellish to give a report.

Cllr Mrs Mellish confirmed that she had attended a Local Action Group meeting on Friday, 10th October 2008, where the removal of the toilet block had been discussed. The matter was on hold pending reports for costings of demolition, refurbishment or replacement.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, resumed the meeting.

1368. To receive reports of Working Parties

i) Local Development Framework

Cllr Clark reported that he, Cllr Geary, Cllr Mrs Sharp and the Deputy Clerk had held a meeting with Mr Alan Gomm, LDF Manager, BCKL&WN. Mr Gomm had provided an update of the current LDF schedule. Cllr Clark would be having a monthly briefing with Mr Gomm.

Town Hall

i) Report from Town Hall Management Team

Proposed – The Mayor Cllr Leach

1369. Fire Station Car Park

i) Report from the Working Party on the progress of the Car Park

Cllr Doyle reported that the Old Fire Station car park had been opened on Monday, 15th September 2008. The Citizen of the Year, Mrs Mary Rose, had cut the ribbon.

ii) Report from the Working Party on the Heritage Centre

Cllr Doyle reported that discussions with the Heritage Centre were ongoing and applications for funding were still being considered.

1370. Report on the purchase of the Howdale Community Centre

Details had been provided in the Clerk’s Report. There was nothing further to report on this item.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, adjourned the meeting for public participation.

A member of public wished to know why the Town Council were purchasing the Howdale Community Centre.

Cllr Doyle confirmed that the Howdale Community Centre was a community building, set within 6.5 acres of land, which was used extensively by many local organisations. The Council were seeking to purchase the Howdale Community Centre to prevent it being developed in the future.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, resumed the meeting.

1371. To discuss the following proposal:

‘That Planning and Environmental Committee recommends to Full Council that the Town Pump is removed from the Town Square.’

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, informed members that this item would be deferred to a future meeting.

1372. To discuss the future development of the land adjacent to the Relief Channel

Cllr Teverson reported that he, the Mayor, Cllr Leach, and Cllr Doyle had met to discuss what procedures would need to take place for the possible acquisition of the land adjacent to the Relief Channel. Cllr Teverson would circulate notes from the meeting to all Councillors.

1373. To discuss taking back the management of The Howdale from the BCKL&WN

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, reported that the possible acquisition of The Howdale, Memorial Playing Fields and The Willows, current assets of the BCKL&WN, had been discussed with Cllr Nick Daubney, Leader of the BCKL&WN. Cllr Daubney advised that he would form a Working Party to investigate these matters and report back without delay.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, adjourned the meeting for public participation.

A member of public advised that the street names surrounding The Howdale were very confusing.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, confirmed that the Post Office would be responsible for altering any street names.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, resumed the meeting.

1374. To discuss recommendation from the Development Committee that this Council supports ‘Restrictions on Drinking Alcohol in Designated Public Places’

An information leaflet had been circulated (Appendix 4).

Cllr Ford reported that a restriction on drinking alcohol in designated public places was an initiative from the police. It was not a mechanism to ban alcohol from public places, but allow the police to control it if it were being abused by unruly people.

1375. To discuss proposition from the Finance and General Purposes Committee

‘That the Finance and General Purposes Committee recommends that the Full Council passes a resolution whereby it is undertaken that the Festival Committee will not be financially disadvantaged by the change of ownership of the Town Hall.’

Cllr Stacey reported that under the ownership of the BCKL&WN, usage of the Town Hall by the Festival Committee had been provided free of charge. The Festival Committee had been

given exclusive use of the Town Hall for the eight days during Festival Week, and the Bar Room for monthly two-hour meetings. At the current rates, this saved the Festival Committee £2,300 for Festival Week and £275.00 per annum for meetings.

Cllr Ford advised that the Interim Management Committee had discussed this matter and felt that in view of the £5,000 annual grant provided by the Town Council, the Festival Committee should in future budget its expenses, including the cost of hiring the Town Hall, and submit the figure to the Town Council in a bid for its annual grant. This item had then been referred to the Finance and General Purposes Committee for consideration.

Cllr Teverson confirmed that at a recent Finance and General Purposes Committee, Members had agreed that the Festival Committee should not be penalised because of the change of ownership.

‘That the Town Council agrees to undertake that the Festival Committee will not be financially disadvantaged by the change of ownership of the Town Hall.’

1333. To receive Members' Apologies for Absence

Apologies had been received from Cllr M G Ford (holiday) and Borough Cllr A M Lovett.

The apologies were accepted.

1334. Evacuation Procedures

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, notified those present of the emergency evacuation procedure from the Town Council offices.

1335. To receive Members' Declarations of Interest

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, Cllr Fox and Cllr Sampson declared a pecuniary interest in item 1343, Payment of Bills. Cllr Sharp declared a prejudicial interest in item 1350, Land at Snape Lane/Nelson Avenue. Cllr Teverson declared a prejudicial interest in item 1348, The Local Government Review.

Cllr Mrs Nunn declared a pecuniary interest in item 1356, Development of the Relief Channel.

Cllr Doyle informed Councillors that himself and the Events Co-ordinator had attended the Anglia In Bloom Reception, and was pleased to announce that Downham Market had received a Silver Award.

Adjourn meeting for public participation and reports

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, adjourned the meeting.

County Councillor

Cllr Mrs Hutson reported that on the 17th September 2008, the street lights between Victory Road and Tesco's would be connected.

Borough Councillor

There was nothing to report.

Proposed – The Mayor Cllr Leach

‘To invoke standing order 17, in order to vary the order of business and bring forward item 4 ‘To discuss the removal of the toilet block on the Howdale’ and item 5 ‘To discuss CCTV’.

All in Favour

1336. To discuss the removal of the toilet block on the Howdale

PC Smith reported that Mr Luke Cox of the BCKL&WN had sent a letter regarding the toilets on the Howdale; however the Town Council had not received this letter. PC Smith advised that he was representing the residents, Mr Cox and The Core Team. There had been anti social behaviour problems at the Howdale, which had been plaguing residents and the Safer Neighbourhood Team for quite some time. The toilet block had been out of commission for around 3 years and was currently only used once a year to provide water for the annual Festival. It had been a target for vandalism, drug dealing, and graffiti youths had been climbing on the roof which was an annoyance for the surrounding residents. It was also not up to recommended health and safety standards and would cost a lot financially to bring it up to an acceptable level. The BCKL&WN and the Problem Solving Team wished to remove the toilet block completely. Should water be needed in the future for the Festival, there was a water hydrant 10 meters from the toilet block.

The Mayor advised that not all residents were in favour of the toilet block being removed. The Town Council was in possession of letters asking for them to be repaired.

Cllr Mrs Starling noted that although the toilet block did look a mess the BCKL&WN should be accountable for its demolition and replacement. The Town Council try to encourage people to use the Howdale and anti vandalism paint on the roof could be used as a deterrent.

Cllr Mrs Nunn noted that the toilet block was an eyesore and was being misused. Unless it could be replaced with a modern toilet it should be knocked down.

Cllr Stacey noted that the Town Council were hoping to own the Howdale in the future and because this area was an amenity for the residents of the Town, it would be essential for a toilet block to be located there.

Cllr Groom noted that problems started with the toilet block a long time ago. The toilet block should be upgraded and relocated.

Cllr Fox noted that there had always been a toilet block on the Howdale and it would be a huge retrograde step to remove the toilets completely. The BCKL&WN had done nothing to maintain the building and keep it at a satisfactory level.

A short discussion took place. The Mayor, Cllr Leach, added that there were not enough toilets in this town and if the BCKL&WN took these away it would be very wrong.

PC Smith was unaware about the residents that had written to the Town Council requesting that the toilet block not be removed. He advised that because the toilets had been closed for 3 years, due to vandalism, to rebuild would be a costly venture.

Borough Cllr Mrs Mellish advised members to seek costings before any decision was made.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, resumed the meeting.

Proposed – Cllr Stacey

Seconded – Cllr Groom

‘That the toilets are not removed unless they are replaced by a suitable modern toilet or if they are to be retained they would be completely upgraded.’

All in favour

Cllr Roberts requested that a letter be sent to the BCKL&WN stating this Council’s proposition and request a list of full costings. The Clerk would deal with this.

Cllr Stacey wished to congratulate PC Smith on his presentation and that the decision of this Council did not reflect poorly on him.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach adjourned the meeting to discuss CCTV.

1337. To discuss CCTV

A proposal for CCTV had been circulated to Members (Appendix 1).

Mr Weeks advised that 18 months ago he and Mr Greenhalgh had been approached by the Town Council for a CCTV system to suit the allocated budget. However, over the last few months there had been complications. After much discussion an improved system had helped to bring down capital and revenue costs. This system would provide two fixed locations as opposed to three WIFI points.

The capital cost for the new system was now around £33,500, and the BCKL&WN would provide the cameras free of charge.

Q: How much would the Town Council pay towards this? (PAR).

A: £15,000 would be contributed. The Town Council would pay £18,500. The revenue costs are £2,500 for camera 1 per annum, £1,225 for camera 2 per annum, plus the revenue cost for the BT Collection Hub of £4,100 per year. Overall the annual cost would be £7,800 to maintain and monitor the cameras and hub.

Q: What distances will the cameras monitor and where will the views be from? (PBS).

A: One camera will be placed on the lamp post opposite the Town Hall car park toilets which will cover the road to the White Hart and the other will be placed on the lamp post opposite the Town Hall to cover the Town Square and the Swan Hotel.

PC Paul Smith added that the cameras had been placed in these locations because they were particular 'Hot Spots' in the Town Centre.

Q: Would there be an option for expansion? (ADS).

A: Yes, extra cameras can be added.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, thanked Mr Weeks and Mr Greenhalgh for attending and informed Members that this matter will be discussed further within the Finance and General Purposes Committee and the Car Parks and Highways Committee.

The Mayor, Cllr Leach, resumed the meeting.

1338. To approve the Minutes

The minutes of the Town Council meetings held on Tuesday 8th July, 2008 (pages 2505-2512) and Tuesday 29th July, 2008 (2528-2532) were approved and signed as a true and accurate record.

1339. To receive correspondence

Cllr Doyle noted how pleased he was that Mr Tinker Taylor would be having a street named after him in Downham Market called 'Tinkers Way'.

1340. To receive Councillors questions

Q: I would like this Council to consider taking back the total management of the Howdale.

A: This will be placed on the Agenda at the next Full Council meeting.

Q. There is rubbish being generated by the boats at the landing stage on the Relief Channel, Downham West side of the Town. This litter is being left in litter bins and dog bins. Could the Clerk enquire with the BCKL&WN if it would be possible to have litter bins placed by the landing stage?

A: Yes.

Q: Are the Town trees weeded on a regular basis?

A: Holly Landscapes is now weeding them.

Q: The BCKL&WN recently sent a map and booklet on sports provisions to residents but the map is out of date. This is a waste of tax-payers money. Could the Clerk inform the BCKL&WN?

A: The Clerk will write to the BCKL&WN to inform them.

Q: The next CAG meeting will be held at 7.00pm on Wednesday 10th September 2008 in Hilgay Village Hall.
